SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions: Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing. Keep people away from and upwind

of spill/leak. Do not touch

damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing (Section 8).

Warn

unnecessary personnel to move away. Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Ensure adequate ventilation.

Isolate the hazard area and deny entry to unnecessary and unprotected personnel.

Personal protective equipment: Wear eye protection (splash goggles) and face protection (full length face shield). Lab coat. Dust

respirator. Be sure to use a MSHA/NIOSH approved respirator or equivalent. Wear protective gloves (nitrile).

Emergency procedures: Prevent dust cloud. In case of a spill and/or a leak, always shut off any sources of ignition, ventilate the

area, and exercise caution. Do not touch damaged containers or spilled material unless wearing appropriate protective clothing. Warn personnel to move away. Prevent entry into sewers, basements

or

confined areas; dike if needed.

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

ELIMINATE all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Stop leak if

without risk. Absorb with an inert material and put

the spilled material in an appropriate waste disposal container. Use clean non-sparking tools to collect

absorbed material. Dike far ahead of spill; use drysand to contain the flow of material. Ventilate the area.

Environmental precautions:

Environmental hazard. Do not let product enter drains. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do

so. Water runoff can cause environmental

damage. Prevent entry into sewers, basements or confined areas; dike if needed.
